Congressman Demands Anti-Motorcycle Explanation from CDC:

U.S. Representative Tim Walberg (R-MI), a member of the Congressional Motorcycle Caucus, has sent a letter to the Director of the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention demanding answers concerning a recent CDC report that aims to discourage motorcycle use while ignoring the positive economic benefits for motorcycle riding. "As an avid & experienced motorcycle rider, I believe Gov't should be in the business of promoting the recreational, economic & environmental benefits of responsible motorcycle riding – not discouraging it," stated Congressman Walberg in the letter. "During difficult fiscal times, the American people would be better served by your continued efforts to address widespread societal health matters such as virus prevention, cancer & heart disease." Rep. Walberg was prompted to action by a presentation given by the Helmet Law Review Team of the Community Preventative Services Task Force in late October 2013 which concluded that mandatory helmet laws would "produce substantial economic benefits." Walberg is troubled by the fact that potential negative impacts on nationwide motorcycling are not addressed & questions whether the CDC should be tasked with researching & making recommendations regarding transportation safety. The Michigan Representative has also been prompted to ask CDC Director Thomas Frieden; "is it the goal or strategy of the CDC to reduce the use of motorcycles - a legal mode of transportation - by recommending & pursuing a federal helmet law?"

Global Motorcycle Industry Projected Expansion: The Global Motorcycle Industry is projected to reach \$93.67 Billion by 2017, according to Lucintel, a leading global management consulting & market research firm. Lucintel has analyzed the top 5 global motorcycle companies & offers its findings in a comprehensive

research report in “Top Five Global Motorcycle Companies: Performance, Strategies, & Competitive Analysis.” Lucintel observes the evolving of the global motorcycle industry, competitive landscape, & corporate & marketing strategies adopted by the motorcycle companies as some of the factors to have remarkably impacted the global motorcycle industry dynamics. The market witnessed splendid growth during 2006-2011 but is likely to grow with reduced pace to reach an estimated \$93.67 billion by 2017. The competitive landscape of the global motorcycle industry has had fluctuations over the last 5 years which affected the top 5 companies. Lucintel found that the market size or revenue, average operating profit, average net profit, & annual growth rate are some of the driving forces of these companies. Buyers power, degree of competition, & threats of new entrants & substitutes also affect this market. Following are the top 5 companies of the global motorcycle industry: Honda Motor Company Limited; Yamaha Motor Company Limited; Hero MotoCorp Limited; Bajaj Auto Limited; & H-D Inc. Developing regions, such as Asia & Latin America, which perceive two-wheelers as a basic mode of transportation, are expected to remain the most promising markets for scooters, light motorcycles, & mopeds. A combination of factors such as demographic condition, economic condition, & environmental regulations is seen to have important impact on market dynamics.

U.S. Traffic Deaths Rise for the First Time Since 2005: For 6 years through 2011, highway accidents & related fatalities declined each year. Improvements in vehicles & other safety education efforts were credited for that downward trend. But for the first time since 2005, that streak ran out, according to figures released recently by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. Last year, 33,561 people were killed in highway accidents, up 3.3% from 2011. The increase was reflected across many of the categories that researchers follow, but motorcycle & pedestrian fatalities reflected the highest increases, up 7% & 6% respectively. There are currently more motorcycles in use in the U.S. than ever before, & 452,386 new on- & off-road motorcycles were sold nationwide in 2012 according to the Motorcycle Industry Council, up 2.6% over 2011. In addition to the deaths, the NHTSA data showed that nearly 2.4 million people were injured in crashes last year, a 6.5% increase from 2011, although miles driven remained about the same. Despite these increases, the new numbers are still far below the accident rates of the 1970s & 1980s. NHTSA preliminary data for the first 6 months of 2013 show that 15,470 people have died in crashes so far this year, a decrease of 4.2% compared with the same period last year.

Motorcyclists Safer Behind the Wheel: Evidence suggests that roads would be safer if more drivers rode motorcycles, as motorcyclists are safer behind the wheel of a car than non-motorcyclists, according to a leading U.K. insurer. Equity Red Star compared car drivers to car users who also have an insured motorcycle, & found the latter 23% less likely on average to make a claim on their car policy. The firm also adjusted the figures to take into account the different typical ages of car drivers & motorcyclists, & still found the riders to be 21% better behind the wheel. The results showed motorcyclists were 20% less likely to make a bodily injury claim on their car policy. The insurer examined 200 million policies between 2007 & 2012. Rob Clark, Equity Red Star’s Head of Retail Motor, said: “A motorcyclist could, behind the wheel of a car, be said to be 23% better.” Clark presented the data during a conference organized by the Motorcycle Industry Association at the Dept for Transport in London to examine evidence that increasing the number of motorcyclists on the road could actually improve safety.

Motorcycle Thefts Decline Slightly: Your motorcycle could be stolen in a New York minute, especially if you live in NYC which is the nation’s capital of motorcycle thievery (903 thefts), followed by swingin’ Las Vegas (757), the Nat’l Insurance Crime Bureau reports. Next comes San Diego (633), Indianapolis (584) & Miami (535). Overall, just like when it comes to car thefts, motorcycle thefts have been dropping. In 2012, the year in which the NICB bases its analysis, they amounted to 46,061 ripped-off bikes, down 1% from the year before. Based on Nat’l Crime Information Center motorcycle theft data for 2012, Honda was the motorcycle brand stolen most often, with 9,082 for the year (representing 20% of all motorcycles stolen). It was followed by Yamaha (7,517=16%), Suzuki (7,017=15%), Kawasaki (4,839=11%) & H-D (3,755=8%), rounding out the top 5 makes. When it comes to states, thieves appear to prefer warm weather -- just like all motorcycle riders. Calif was first (6,082 thefts), followed by Florida (4,110), TX (3,400), N.C. (2,574) & Indiana (2,334), & more than twice as many bikes were stolen during summer months than in the winter. Unfortunately, fewer stolen motorcycles are recovered than cars. While 53.9% of stolen cars were returned to their owners, only 39% of motorcycles found their way back. The NICB says that’s because it’s easier to “chop” bikes for their parts, hide them in barns or garages, or ship them out of the country in giant containers.

Feds Set Up Roadblocks to Harvest DNA Samples: Federal contractors have been setting up roadblocks in cities across the country with the purpose of collecting DNA samples from passing motorists. The multi-million dollar Fed program has been disturbing drivers & alarming civil libertarians. The checkpoints consist of uniformed agents blocking a public road & flagging drivers into a testing area or a parking lot. There, the drivers are requested to submit a saliva or blood sample to the Fed Gov’t. The roadblocks were part of a study orchestrated by the Nat’l Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The program costs taxpayers \$7.9 million over 3 years, according to NBC News Dallas-Fort Worth. The agency confirmed that the operation is currently being launched in 30 different U.S. cities. “How voluntary is it when you have a police officer in uniform flagging you down?” asked Susan Watson, executive director of the Alabama chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union. “Are you going to stop? Yes, you’re going to stop.” “Although this was voluntary it was not voluntary that you stop & hear the DNA for CASH pitch,” said one Alabama resident after experiencing a checkpoint in June. Drivers are offered cash for surrendering DNA samples. The going rate is \$10 for a cheek-swab & \$50 for blood drawn from the vein. The goal, according to the NHTSA, is to decrease impaired-driving accidents by analyzing raw bodily fluids fresh off the street.

LAPD to Pay \$10 Million in Ticket Quota Controversy: The Los Angeles City Council has agreed to pay nearly \$6 million to a group of police officers who accused their superiors of imposing a secret traffic ticket quota system. The \$5.9 million settlement resolves a pair of lawsuits filed in 2010 by 11 LAPD officers assigned to a motorcycle unit. In the lawsuits, the officers detailed what they claimed were strict demands to write at least 18 traffic tickets each shift & that 80% of the citations be for major violations. Officers who failed to meet the alleged ticket minimums or raised concerns about them were reprimanded, denied overtime assignments, given undesirable work schedules, & subjected to other forms of harassment, including being kicked out of the motorcycle unit, according to the L.A. Times. The settlement, approved unanimously, brings to more than \$10 million the amount of taxpayer money spent on payouts & legal

fees from the ticket quota cases. But that number could grow because one more officer's case is still pending. The ticket controversy has been a black eye for the Los Angeles P.D., because ticket quotas are against state law.

Recreational Motorcyclists Across Australia Protest Anti-Bikie Laws: Recreational motorcyclists are protesting across Australia to show solidarity against Queensland's tough new anti-bikie laws. Queensland organizer Gabriel Buckley told the *Australian Associated Press* that the new laws, aimed at criminal "bikie" gangs, have resulted in the harassment of law-abiding motorcyclists. Rallies were planned in major capital cities, with the biggest rally in Brisbane where over a thousand independent riders rallied with patch-wearing bikers at parliament house. According to Buckley, a primary concern is that the laws reverse the onus on proof for people accused of links to prescribed criminal gangs. "Some people are being pulled over 3 times on their way to work," he told AAP. Freedom Riders Victoria spokesman Dale Maggs said Queensland's anti-association laws unfairly affected all motorcyclists & scooter riders, allowing police to stop & question groups of 3 or more riders. **Harley Owners Group** member Stuart told the *Leader* newspaper that anti-bikie laws targeted 0.3% of Australian crime, referring to research presented by Victoria University Adjunct Professor, Dr Arthur Veno. "Every time you want to ride with 3 people it's a gang? That's ridiculous. There's the Ulysses clubs, there's HOG clubs, there's Christian movement clubs, there's even scooter clubs & we're all tarred with the same brush & it's just not right." Police & the Newman Gov't have previously asked recreational riders for patience amid the bikie crackdown, but concede there will be disruptions for law-abiding motorcyclists.

Bail fight over alleged bikie James Cleave may land in Supreme Court – Dec 2, 2013 – *Australia* - By Josh Robertson; www.PerthNow.com.au - Lawyers for one of the first bikies locked up under the state's anti-association laws say they may take his fight for bail to the Supreme Court. James Cleave, who was arrested last month at Gold Coast hotel Palazzo Versace with 2 other alleged Mongols bikies, was remanded in custody yesterday by Brisbane Magistrate Ray Rinaudo. New laws mean members & associates of "criminal motorcycle gangs" are automatically refused bail unless they can "show cause" why they should be released. Defense barrister Craig Eberhardt argued Cleave had not become a member of the Mongols because he had misgivings about the "patchover" by former Finks clubmates. Cleave's solicitor Mark Williams said consideration was being given to a fresh Supreme Court bail application.

QLD police deny claims of strip searching of motorcyclists – Dec 3, 2013 – *Australia* – By APP; www.TheAustralian.com.au - Queensland police deny they are conducting roadside strip searches of motorcyclists amid the crackdown on criminal bikies. A day after a soldier complained of being strip-searched while riding his motorcycle, a caller to ABC Radio has told of a workmate who was pulled over by police & asked to remove parts of his motorcycle & lift his shirt to reveal any tattoos. The caller said his colleague, who was not connected with any outlaw bikie gang, was held up for 45 minutes on his way home. "They were looking for tattoos, which he didn't have," the caller said, adding officers equipped with a camera asked him to lift his shirt up to his neck to expose his chest & back. Police Supt Jim Keogh, who is leading Taskforce Takeback aimed at criminal bikies, admitted police were asking riders to show their tattoos. But he said riders did not have to comply unless police were taking formal action against them. "I haven't heard of anybody being strip-searched out on the street," Supt Keogh told the ABC today. "Legally we can strip-search in the watchhouse but we rarely do it. So I find it hard to believe that they would strip-search, to the full extent, anybody in the street. "We're not asking them to take their shirt off. If they've got tattoos there that are visible under the shirt, if they wouldn't mind showing them to us, yep absolutely. But again, it's by consent." Supt Keogh said police were able to store photos of people's tattoos for identification purposes, but there was no tattoo register as such. "There's nothing to suggest that these people who are displaying their tattoos, as we've talked about, are in fact getting them recorded," he said. But he said police were within their rights to record identifying particulars, including tattoos, when formal proceedings were commenced against anyone. Supt Keogh could not say how many images of tattoos were currently held by police, nor how many tattoo images had been collected since Queensland's new bikie laws were introduced. But he added: "They'd be the criminal motorcycle gang members who have been arrested". Supt Keogh said riders not subject to formal police proceedings could refuse to show officers their tattoos. QLD's tough anti-bikie laws sparked rallies by recreational motorcyclists around Australia at the weekend.

Gangs In Rochester - Dec 3, 2013 – *Minnesota* – By The Aging Rebel; www.AgingRebel.com - The next biker civil rights case has been brewing for a little over a month in Rochester, Minnesota where the local police & a city attorney named Terry Adkins have pooled their experience & training & declared the Sons of Silence & the Med City Crew MCs to be “criminal gangs.” The declaration violates a Minnesota State Law which specifically forbids discrimination against club members who are flying colors. The law is Minnesota Statute 604.12 which states that access to public establishments cannot be denied to “a person who operates a motorcycle or is wearing clothing that displays the name of an organization or association,” unless that person’s behavior is endangering other people or property, or his clothing “is obscene or includes the name or symbol of a criminal gang.” The legal dispute may eventually determine whether it is reasonable to call the 2 clubs “criminal gangs.”

Gangs: Social Scientists have been trying to accurately define the vague term “gang” since the juvenile delinquency panic in the 1950s. Most sociologists agree that “gangs” are social organizations that exist to serve the social needs of individuals who feel marginalized by society. California, which was a pioneer in formalized name calling, uses the even vaguer term “criminal street gang” to create separate laws for people the police don’t like. “Criminal Street Gang” is defined under California law as “any organization, association or group of 3 or more persons, whether formal or informal, which (1) has continuity of purpose, (2) seeks a group identity, & (3) has members who individually or collectively engage in or have engaged in a pattern of criminal activity.” Most rational & educated persons understand that the California definition is logically circular. It also uses the same logic that is applied in the federal judiciary to define the equally vague idea of a “racketeering enterprise.” The federal notion is that if some members of a social group are criminals then all members of that group must also be criminal. In the federal Central District of California, the premise of a case called *USA v. Mongol Nation*, an Unincorporated Association, is that since, as recently as 5 years ago, some members of the Mongols MC were criminals that entire social organization must be a criminal racket. It is a naked accusation against which all members of the Mongols must now defend themselves. The Minnesota law that defines “criminal gangs” closely follows the current interpretation of the federal Racketeer Influenced & Corrupt Organizations Act which defines a “pattern of racketeering activity” as 2 or more criminal acts committed by 3 or more persons during the previous decade.

In Rochester: The current dispute in Rochester began when Michael Bader, an attorney representing the Confederation of Clubs of Minnesota, accused Rochester police of telling bar & restaurant owners to deny service to members of the 2 clubs. Bader wrote City Attorney Adkins a letter telling him that the 2 local chapters do not have a history of violence & asked him to enforce Minnesota Statute 604.12. Adkins wrote Bader back 3 weeks later & told him “The Rochester P.D. tells me that the Sons of Silence is a motorcycle criminal gang with a common name whose members wear clothing containing an identifying sign/symbol.” He quoted a Dept of Justice memo which defines the Sons of Silence as “an organization whose members use their motorcycle club as a conduit for criminal enterprises.” And he cited 5 criminal convictions involving Sons patch holders in Rochester & St. Cloud, Minnesota, & in Iowa & Colorado between 1999 & 2013. Adkins wrote, “As such, I have concluded that the Sons of Silence is a ‘criminal gang’ as that term is defined by Minnesota Statute 609.229, subdivision 1.” Members of the Med City Crew will also continue to be banned because they belong to a motorcycle club that maintains cordial & friendly relations with the Sons. The next step will be litigation.

Chaplain airs worries over bikie laws – Dec 3, 2013 – *Australia* – By www.ABC.net.au - A Townsville chaplain has questioned the QLD Govt’s bikie laws that see inmates segregated. Phil Heang says an inmate at the Townsville Correctional Centre has been placed in solitary confinement, despite being in prison before the laws came into effect. The Dept of Justice says members of criminal motorcycle gangs are separated from the general prison population to disrupt attempts to continue criminal activities inside prisons. Heang says the laws are unfair. “He’s a trusted prisoner, he’s been working towards his rehabilitation, he was actually working in the prison workshop which only trusted men are allowed to do, he was taken & handcuffed on the 29th of Oct & put in solitary confinement,” he said. “I said, ‘what’s happened, what have you done?’ He said, ‘I haven’t done anything, I’ve been put in solitary confinement, it’s not because I’ve misbehaved, it’s because of these new bikie laws’, they’ve been applied to prisoners who are already in prison who’ve been convicted & sentenced, the laws have been applied retrospectively.”

Allaina Jones, girlfriend of Hells Angel John Fahey, stands by her man as he appears in court charged with affray – Dec 4, 2013 – *Australia* – By Greg Stolz; www.CourierMail.com.au - She’s the loyal bikie girlfriend standing by her notorious man. With her long, dyed red locks, heavily tattooed body & figure-hugging black outfit, Allaina Jones cut a striking figure at Southport Magistrates Court on Tuesday. Ms. Jones, 23, was there to support one of Australia’s most feared bikies, former Bandidos enforcer turned Hells Angel John Fahey, 37. Wanted over a Burleigh Heads gym brawl with -Nomads bikies last month, -Fahey was “taken down” by elite Special Emergency Response Team officers in a dramatic arrest at a Mermaid Waters fast food outlet on Mon. Amid the Newman Govt’s massive bikie blitz, gang members - who usually turn out in force to back each other - have become conspicuous by their absence at courts these days unless they are a defendant. But Ms. Jones, the mother of 1 of Fahey’s 3 children, was there yesterday - despite being the subject of an apprehended violence order against him. Her show of loyalty was wasted as Fahey was excused from appearing due to injuries suffered in his no-nonsense arrest. He was charged with -affray over a brawl with Nomads bikies at a Burleigh Heads gym last month, as well as steroid possession. Outside court, defense lawyer Jodi Allen said there was no suggestion police had used excessive force. Fahey, a former Bandidos Nat’l sergeant-at-arms, was recruited by the Hells Angels late last year to establish a Gold Coast beachhead for the gang. His defection ramped up tension between Gold Coast bikie gangs, erupting in a brawl outside a Broadbeach restaurant in Oct which sparked the Newman Govt’s bikie crackdown. Fahey will spend Christmas behind bars after being remanded in custody until Jan 29. **Allaina Jones tattoo reads:** I am good but I’m not an angel. I do sin but I am not the devil. I am just a small girl in a big world.

Old Umbrellas: There were protesters at the grocery store handing out pamphlets on the evils of America. I politely declined to take one. Hells Angel in Cottonwood bar fight - Dec 5, 2013 - *Arizona* - By www.cvbugle.com - The Yavapai County Gang & Immigration Intelligence Team Enforcement Mission (G.I.I.T.E.M.) detectives assisted Cottonwood P.D. with an investigation at Rockin B Saloon in Cottonwood for a report of a fight Aug. 10. Two males allegedly assaulted another male following an arm-wrestling match. Detectives were able to determine the identity of the suspects in the assault through video footage as Bruce Andrew Schweigert Sr. & Bruce Andrew Schweigert Jr. G.I.I.T.E.M. Detectives gathered additional evidence identifying Bruce Schweigert Sr. as a member of the Hell's Angels. Schweigert Sr. was arrested & charged with felony threatening or intimidating, misdemeanor assault, misdemeanor disorderly conduct & 3 counts of felony misconduct involving weapons. Schweigert Jr. was charged with assault & disorderly conduct. Rockin B Saloon bar owner Ian Koons was also arrested & charged with false reporting to law enforcement.

Prison criticized as Hells Angel fails to face court – Dec 12, 2013 – *Australia* – By Adam Cooper; www.theage.com.au - A magistrate has again criticised Victorian prison authorities for failing to bring high-profile Hells Angels bikie Peter “Skitzo” Hewat before the court. Hewat was scheduled to appear at Melbourne Magistrates Court on Thu to answer 2 separate sets of charges, one in relation to punching a woman in a dispute over a dog & the second over allegations that he threatened a real estate agent. But the failure of Corrections Victoria staff to have him brought to the court until 12.40pm meant both sets of charges were adjourned until next month. Barrister Shane Tyrrell told magistrate Gerard Lethbridge that by the time Hewat arrived at the court's holding cells, he was “seriously aggrieved” & “not in a proper frame of mind to be brought in” to the courtroom. Lethbridge replied: “This court condemns authorities for not bringing him before the court. Likewise, if the prisoner is to appear before the court he appears before the court.” Tyrrell said he needed to get more instructions from his client. In Oct Lethbridge voiced his frustration at Hewat's failure to appear at court, caused by a lack of room in the cells of the court complex. The problem has caused delays in dozens of criminal cases in recent months, which has frustrated magistrates, lawyers & police. Lethbridge said in Oct: “This is just getting so far beyond a joke. Witnesses are subpoenaed. For the executive branch of Gov't to ignore court orders is absolutely staggering.” Tyrrell said this was the third time Hewat had not been brought before the court. Earlier in the day Tyrrell made an application for costs to deputy chief magistrate Dan Muling against Corrections Victoria. Hewat, 58, the HAs' East County sergeant-at-arms, is due to plead guilty to 2 charges of assault for punching a woman in the face on March 23 in a dispute over his family's shih tzu terrier. That matter is scheduled to be heard before Lethbridge on Jan 22. Hewat is also charged with extortion & assault after he allegedly stood over & threatened a real estate agent in Feb in Campbellfield. Those charges are scheduled to be heard by Muling on Jan 29. Hewat is also set to plead guilty to other charges of operating a tow truck without a license. He was remanded.

Special Memory Gang Enhancements – Dec 12, 2013 – *Nevada* – By The Aging Rebel; www.AgingRebel.com - Kenneth Cory, the judge in the Special Memory Wedding Chapel stabbing case, agreed to hold a hearing to determine whether Nevada's Gang Crime Enhancement statute should apply to members of the Hells Angels MC. The judge's ruling in the case will apply to the sentencing of 4 men named John Dawson, Dominic Orlando, Armando Porras & Brandon Young. The 4 men each pled guilty last summer to one count of battery resulting in substantial bodily harm. They each face up to 5 years in prison. The hearing will feature the testimony of “outlaw motorcycle gang” investigators who will offer practiced testimony about “Characteristics of persons who are members of criminal gangs; Specific rivalries between criminal gangs; Common practices & operations of criminal gangs & the members of those gangs; Social customs & behavior of members of criminal gangs; Terminology used by members of criminal gangs; Codes of conduct, including criminal conduct, of particular criminal gangs; & The types of crimes that are likely to be committed by a particular criminal gang or by criminal gangs in general.” Criminal “gang enhancements” are common & have never been Constitutionally challenged.

NRS 193.168: The relevant law is Nevada Revised Statute 193.168. It defines a “criminal gang” as “any combination of persons, organized formally or informally, so constructed that the organization will continue its operation even if individual members enter or leave the organization, & which: (a) Has a common name or identifying symbol; (b) Has particular conduct, status & customs indicative of it; & (c) Has as one of its common activities engaging in criminal activity punishable as a felony, other than the conduct which constitutes the primary offense.” The law also states that “the court shall not grant probation to or suspend the sentence of any person convicted of a felony committed for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in affiliation with, a criminal gang if an additional term of imprisonment may be imposed for that primary offense pursuant to this section. The court may, upon the receipt of an appropriate motion, reduce or suspend the sentence imposed for the primary offense if it finds that the defendant rendered substantial assistance in the arrest or conviction of any other principals, accomplices, accessories or coconspirators to the crime, or of any other persons involved in the commission of a felony which was committed for the benefit of, at the direction of, or in affiliation with, a criminal gang. The agency which arrested the defendant must be given an opportunity to support or oppose such a motion before it is granted or denied. If good cause is shown, the motion may be heard in camera.”

Special Memory Stabbings: The case began on Dec 20, 2008 when about a dozen guests at a Hells Angels wedding at the Special memory Wedding Chapel in Las Vegas attacked members

of a Mongols wedding party. The brawl lasted about a minute & was captured on surveillance video. Two members of the Mongols wedding party were stabbed & 2 others suffered minor injuries. Prosecutors have described the fight as unprovoked. Tensions were particularly strained between the 2 clubs at the time & defense attorneys have argued that the Hells Angels acted in self-defense. Ten defendants have pled guilty. Former Hells Angel James Murray was sentenced to serve 2 to 10 years in prison last Oct. Three defendants will be sentenced next month. The Hells Angels groom, Brad Goldsmith, & his father, Charles "Peewee" Goldsmith, are scheduled to be sentenced March 18. Neither of the Goldsmiths is currently of member of the motorcycle club. Dawson, Orlando, Porras & Young will be sentenced Feb 28. Two defendants, James Sexey & John Merchant, are scheduled for trial next April.

Sentencing delayed in Hells Angels case in Vegas – Dec 13, 2013 – *Las Vegas, Nevada* – By Ken Ritter, AP; www.SFGate.com - A Nevada judge agreed Wed to hear testimony in Feb about whether the Hells Angels is an outlaw motorcycle gang before sentencing 4 men who pleaded guilty in a 2008 wedding chapel brawl in Las Vegas that left 6 people hurt. Clark County District Court Judge Kenneth Cory conferred in chambers for nearly an hour with lawyers for defendants John Dawson, Dominic Orlando, Armando Porras & Brandon Young before postponing sentencing to Feb 28. The 4 men pleaded guilty in July to 1 felony charge of battery resulting in substantial bodily harm. Each could face up to 5 years in prison & a \$10,000 fine. Porras' atty Chris Rasmussen said the defense wants to present witnesses & evidence that the Hells Angels is not a criminal gang. Rasmussen said later the goal is probation or leniency in sentences. Prosecutors Marc DiGiacomo & Sonia Jimenez didn't object to the delay. The case was previously handled by District Court Judge Michael Villani. It stemmed from fighting between H.A.'s who were leaving 1 ceremony & rival Mongols members arriving by coincidence for another at A Special Memory Wedding Chapel almost 5 years ago. Thirteen accused Hells Angels were indicted in 2010 on charges including attempted murder, conspiracy & taking part in activities of a criminal gang. At least one of the men denied being a Hells Angels member. Trial for 8 defendants ended in a mistrial in August 2012 when Judge Villani ruled that prosecutors failed to fully disclose to defense attorneys evidence including photographs & documents. Ten defendants have since pleaded guilty. Three are due for sentencing in January, while 2 — a former Hells Angels motorcycle club chapter president & his son — are due for sentencing March 18. The father, Charles "Peewee" Goldsmith, could face 2 to 5 years in prison after pleading guilty to coercion & battery with substantial bodily harm with intent to promote or assist the activities of a criminal gang. The son, Brad Goldsmith, was the bridegroom at the ill-fated wedding. He could face 16 months to 4 years after pleading guilty to attempted coercion & battery causing substantial bodily harm. Lawyers for both men have said they are no longer affiliated with the Hells Angels.

Guns seized, pit bull shot during raid targeting Vagos gang member in Irwindale – Dec 18, 2013 – *California* - By Brian Day; www.PasadenaStarNews.com - West Covina police arrested 2 men & fatally shot a pit bull early Wed while serving a search warrant to seize guns at the home of a known outlaw motorcycle gang member in Irwindale, authorities said. "Known, dangerous Vagos outlaw motorcycle gang member" & ex-convict Ralph Rodriguez, 38, of Irwindale was arrested on suspicion of being a felon in possession of firearms, resisting arrest & possession of false identification, according to West Covina police Cpl. Rudy Lopez. He was the person targeted by the search warrant. Also arrested in the 3:30 a.m. raid at a home in the 4600 block of Nora Ave was Robert Ghiloni, 28, of West Covina, on suspicion of possession of a dagger, resisting arrest & an outstanding traffic warrant, Lopez said. The arrests were the result of an ongoing investigation by the West Covina P.D., officials said. After arriving at the home & ordering the occupants out via loudspeaker repeatedly, Ghiloni eventually emerged from the home & was taken into custody, Lopez said. He had a dagger on his person. But Rodriguez remained holed-up inside the home, police said. "After 2 hours of repeated announcements, SWAT then initiated an entry into the residence," according to Lopez. "During the search, (Rodriguez) was located hiding in the attic. He surrendered to officers without further incident. While serving the warrant, SWAT officers encountered a pit bull, which Lopez said became aggressive toward them. "The dog began to attack, forcing officers to fire upon it," he said. "The dog died as a result." The number & type of guns sized from the home was not available late Wed. According to Los Angeles County booking records, Rodriguez was being held in lieu of \$30,000 bail pending a scheduled arraignment Friday in West Covina Superior Court. Ghiloni was being held in lieu of \$10,995 pending his arraignment, also scheduled Friday in West Covina Superior Court.

How suspected gun runner's wife got hired at CHP – Dec 18, 2013 – *California* – By www.News10.net - A woman who boasted to undercover federal agents that her job as a CHP dispatcher had kept at least one of her husband's criminal associates out of jail was apparently hired before she married the ex-con. Sarah Killough, 35, began working for the CHP's Golden Gate Division in Sept 2009. She left the H.P. earlier this month, just days before she & her husband, Dennis, were arrested on multiple felony charges involving illegal weapons & drug sales. According to court documents, the couple told undercover ATF agents that Sarah was a CHP dispatcher who was "looking after him" & had used information she gathered as a dispatcher to warn him & his associates that law enforcement was enroute. Dennis Killough, 42, served time in state prison for a previous offense & is a member of the Hells Angels MC. Online documents & social media suggest the couple married well after Sarah got the dispatch job. CHP Valley Division spokeswoman Sgt. Diana McDermott would not speak specifically about the case, but suggested the results of Sarah's pre-employment background check might have been different if she had been married to the convicted felon in 2009. "If she is married or living with someone with a criminal background, that is something we would investigate further," McDermott said. "If a person is not involved with someone during the background check, we won't know about it." McDermott said the CHP does not conduct additional background checks without probable cause after an employee has been hired. Dennis Killough is being held in the Yolo County Jail without bail. His wife is seeking to be released on her own recognizance at a bail hearing Thursday morning. The Yolo County District Atty's Office is fighting Sarah Killough's release, claiming her knowledge of law enforcement operations makes her dangerous.

Hells Angels member & wife busted in Vacaville linked to Yolo County weapons crimes – Dec 18, 2013 - *California* - By Sarah Dowling; www.DailyDemocrat.com - Dennis Killough, a member of the Hells Angels MC & his wife are in custody after agents with the ATF executed a search warrant at their Vacaville home on Wed night. The 42-year-old Killough, & Sarah Barham Killough, 35, were arrested in connection to a month's long state investigation alleging a number of crimes ranging from selling an assault weapon, & transportation of methamphetamine to bribery, according to ATF special agent Helen Dunkel, Public Info Officer for the San Francisco field division. Although the couple resides in Vacaville, the case is being prosecuted by Yolo County Deputy Assistant Atty Michael Vroman since the Killough's crimes allegedly took place in Yolo County. According to the DA's Office, several months ago, the ATF launched an investigation into Killough, a member of the Hells Angels Vallejo Chapter, who allegedly sold stolen military equipment & an AR-15 rifle to undercover agents, according to Dunkel. The same day, the ATF also served a search warrant at the Hells Angels' Vallejo Chapter clubhouse, where agents seized a handgun, Dunkel said. A sawed-off shotgun was also seized from a Vacaville storage facility being rented by Killough. According to the criminal complaint, Killough is charged with being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm, sale of an assault weapon, being armed with a firearm during a controlled substance offense & transportation of methamphetamine for sale, while his wife faces potential charges of possession of methamphetamine for sale & bribery. Sarah Killough worked as a California H.P. employee since 1999 Fed investigators believe that she used her law enforcement role to provide info to her husband for a drug trafficking transaction with undercover agents. The CHP has confirmed that Sarah Killough was no longer with the Dept as of Dec. 9. With the couple now in custody, the ATF is continuing its investigation into the case, which has included assistance from the Vacaville P.D. & the CHP.

ATF Vallejo Investigation – Dec 18, 2013 – *California* - – By The Aging Rebel; www.AgingRebel.com - A member of the Vallejo, California charter of the Hells Angels MC & his wife have been arrested as a result of an apparent entrapment executed by the ATF. In an attempt to protect that investigation & frustrate press scrutiny of the case, the ATF has not yet announced the arrests in writing & the couple have not yet been federally charged. Helen Dunkel, the Public Information Officer for the ATF's San Francisco Field Division is calling the case the product of a "state investigation." Dennis Killough & his wife Sarah Barham Killough were arrested within the last 3 days. Sarah worked as a dispatcher for the California H.P. CBS television affiliate KOVR is reporting that the CHP terminated Sarah on Dec 9. The couple were arrested at their apartment in Vacaville. The ATF served search warrants on the Killough's apartment, the Hells Angels clubhouse in Vallejo & a storage locker rented by Killough on Dec 13. The case is being prosecuted by Yolo County Deputy Assistant Atty Michael Vroman.

Charges: Dennis Killough is currently charged with being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm, sale of an AR-15 rifle, being armed with a firearm during a major methamphetamine sting & transportation of methamphetamine for sale. Sarah Barham Killough is accused of posing as a Dept of Motor Vehicles investigator in order to trace the owner of license plates. Sarah Killough has worked at the CHP's Vallejo dispatch center since 2009. Bogus, major drug deals are a major weapon in the ATFs arsenal of dirty tricks. Typically, a target who is eager or desperate for cash is offered a large sum of money to provide security for an unspecified transaction. After the target arrives at

the location of the transaction, often a motel room, he is informed that the transaction involves drugs & he is handed a gun. These stings are always videotaped by multiple, hidden cameras. Vroman has filed papers with the court asking that the couple be held without bail.

The Investigation: The investigation that led to the arrests began on Feb 13 & involved undercover ATF agents. Allegedly, Killough sold a stolen rifle scope to the undercovers that month. The agents met both Killoughs in May. Sarah Killough allegedly told agents she would be "in charge" of future transactions at that meeting. According to the ATF, Mrs. Killough admitted to the undercovers that she had warned members of the Vallejo charter of imminent arrests. The ATF alleges that Dennis Killough sold the undercovers an AR-15 last July. Killough is accused of suggesting that the undercovers use his wife's car to transport drugs at that meeting. The bogus drug deal was in Aug when he was allegedly paid \$1,000 for standing guard. ATF agent Dunkel said a "proactive, ongoing investigation" is continuing into the Vallejo charter.

Debate Over Bikies In Oz Continues – Dec 18, 2013 – *Australia* – By The Aging Rebel; www.AgingRebel.com - There is finally some mainstream opposition to the Australian State of Queensland's Hitlerian anti-bikie law, the Vicious Lawless Association Disestablishment Act of 2013. The law was written by a couple of politicians named Campbell Newman & Jarrod Bleijie. Newman is the Premier of Queensland. Bleijie is his Atty General. The VLAD Act became law without public debate. But 2 days ago Gary Johns, a former politician who is now a professional opinionator, excoriated the VLAD Act in The Australian, a Sydney newspaper that is one of the Australian newspapers of record.

Johns Says: Johns guesses that "The theory seems to be that jailing bikies for a long time for the crimes they commit will stop the crimes for which bikies cannot be caught" & notes with particular contempt that imprisoned bikers will be compelled to wear "fluoro pink" uniforms. Johns calls the VLAD Act "the mother of all scare campaigns. Scare campaigns are normally a diversion. Newman does not need a diversion; he has serious work in paying down Labor debt, including preparing Gov't assets for sale & convincing a skeptical public of the benefit. There is plenty of bread; the Gov't does not need to produce circuses." Like any rational person, Johns sees the injustice in automatically adding 15 years to the sentences of anyone accused of belonging to a motorcycle club & 25 years to the sentence of any club officer "even if the person is not sentenced to a period of imprisonment for the original offence." He argues that "Queensland Police data showed the 3 most common offences committed by the outlaw motorcycle gangs were breach of bail, unlicensed or disqualified driving, & low-level possession of dangerous drugs." And, he concludes his brief essay by suggesting Newman, Bleijie & the rest of the Queensland "cabinet should dress in pink until they are rehabilitated."

Bleijie Bleats: In another op-ed piece in tomorrow's Australian Bleijie says Johns' "lack of intelligence regarding the threat posed by criminal motorcycle gangs borders on the astonishing. Their propensity for violence, intimidation & illegality are well-documented around the world." Bleijie doesn't bother to mention that all this criminal dangerousness is documented by morons, scoundrels & hacks with names like Julien Sher, Jay Dobyns & "Charles Falco." Most of Bleijie's rantings reflect circular reasoning & his personal opinions betray an utter lack of actual life experience. He cites hyperbolic accusations made by groups like the Australian Crime Commission & he seems to actually believe that a thousand injustices are necessary to repay the

injustice done to “people such as Kathy Devitt. She was shot in the leg, in the middle of the day, while shopping on the Gold Coast. She was allegedly collateral damage, caught in the cross-fire of escalating conflict between rival bikie gangs. Try telling her gangs are not a problem.” The Kathy Devitt example is reminiscent of the tragedy of Cynthia Garcia in Arizona more than a decade ago. Garcia was murdered by a former Hells Angel & crank fiend named Mike Kramer who soon fled to Los Angeles. Kramer made a deal with the ATF which protected & paid Kramer to help the Bureau “get” other Angels. Bleijie is a politician & he sounds like it. “The Newmann Gov’t has taken the strong, necessary action that Queenslanders demanded & deserve,” he brags at one point. “We have brought in, with Labor Party support, a range of reforms that are hitting criminal gangs head on & from within. We deliberately & unapologetically made the legislation & penalties severe to send a message to the bikie gangs that their time in Queensland was over.”

Second Suspect Named in Steakhouse Stabbing – Dec 19, 2013 – *Texas* – By www.BigCountryHomepage.com - A second suspect has been named in a public stabbing incident that involved the Bandidos MC. In Nov, 2 men were stabbed outside a steakhouse along the Winters Freeway in southwest Abilene during an altercation. One suspect, who was later revealed to be the Pres of the Abilene chapter of the Bandidos, was arrested at a separate location soon after the stabbing. 46-year-old Curtis Jack Lewis was charged with aggravated assault with a deadly weapon for the Nov 2 stabbing. Now police are looking for the sergeant of arms of the Abilene chapter of the Bandidos. According to court documents, Wesley Mason, also known as “Boone,” was picked out of a photo lineup by one of the stabbing victims. Mason has not yet been arrested. Both stabbing victims did not suffer life threatening injuries.

Judge’s rulings set stage for Casey murder trial – Dec 19, 2013 – *Kentucky* – By Todd Kleffman; www.CentralKYnews.com - It’s going to be an interesting trial,” Casey Circuit Court Clerk Craig Overstreet this morning. Overstreet’s assessment of the upcoming murder trial of motorcycle gang member David Salyers is putting it mildly. The case is rife with potential for courtroom drama & a cast of characters Hollywood would find enticing. *Consider:*

- Kentucky State Police has been called upon to beef up courthouse security.
- A record pool of 600 people has been summoned to make sure a jury can be selected.
- A key witness is allegedly dying of cancer.
- A senior Fed agent who once infiltrated the notorious Iron Horsemen MC will testify as an expert for the prosecution.
- A young judge is presiding over her first big criminal case.

Casey Circuit Judge Judy Vance issued several key rulings following a pretrial conference Wed that set the stage for Salyers’ Jan. 6 trial for allegedly orchestrating the murder of Gleason Pyles, who was shot to death while working at Tarter Gate in Sept 2012. On Wed, Vance upheld her earlier ruling that Salyers & co-defendant Bobby Rigdon, who is charged with Pyles’ murder, would be tried separately. Assistant Atty General Shawna Virgin Kincer, called in as a special prosecutor on the case, wanted Salyers & Rigdon to be tried together. Kincer argued that both men are accused of participating in the same crime & that evidence that would be allowed in a joint trial might not be admissible in separate trials. Specifically, Kincer mentioned the prosecution’s plan to call at least 4 witnesses to testify that Salyers had helped bond Rigdon out of jail specifically to kill

Pyles, which would undermine Salyers’ defense that he was simply at the wrong place at the wrong time when the confrontation between Rigdon & Pyles turned deadly. “This distinction is the very difference between premeditated murder & manslaughter,” Kincer argues in her motion to keep the defendants joined. “The Commonwealth must be able to present this evidence in its entirety to show the total picture of how Gleason Pyles was murdered. Severing defendants Rigdon & Salyers hinders the finding of truth, & will be detrimental & ruinous to the Commonwealth’s case.” While that order seems to benefit Salyers’ defense, Vance ruled in favor of the prosecution in allowing Senior Special Agent Earl “Doug” Robinson to testify as an expert on the Iron Horsemen MC, of which Salyers, Rigdon & Pyles were all members. Robinson, a 26-year veteran of the ATF, went undercover to infiltrate the Iron Horsemen in 1998 & will testify about the “culture of motorcycle gangs/clubs.” “This proposed evidence ... is extremely relevant to illuminate the defendants’ motives...” Kincer argues.

According to the prosecution’s theory of the case, Salyers, Pres of the local Horsemen chapter, wanted Pyles dead because he left the motorcycle gang in bad standing & had refused to repay Salyers about \$5,000 he borrowed to buy a motorcycle needed to join the club. With help from the Horsemen, Salyers worked to bond Higdon - who wanted to join the biker gang — out of jail in order to take retribution on Pyles for his alleged transgressions against Salyers & the club, according to court documents.

Jude Hagan, Salyers’ atty, argued that allowing Robinson to testify would be unfair to his client. “Any testimony by Agent Robinson about the Iron Horseman in general would unduly enflame the jury & lend improper credibility to prosecution’s theory as to defendant’s motive,” Hagan argued. “The Commonwealth’s theory that the murder was gang related in general is pure conjecture, & Agent Robinson’s testimony would be unduly prejudicial.” Vance granted another prosecution motion to allow a video deposition to be taken of Anthony Byrd, who is charged with criminal facilitation in Pyles’ murder. Byrd is reportedly dying of cancer & prosecutors wanted to get his testimony on the record so it could be played for the jury in case he is too ill to appear at the trial in person. Byrd, who is Salyers’ brother-in-law, worked at Tarter Gate as Pyles’ supervisor & allegedly arranged for him to be working alone in an isolated building the night he was shot to death. Salyers & Byrd spoke earlier in the day leading up to the murder & his testimony is expected to advance the prosecution’s theory that Salyers’ planned the murder in advance. Hagan contended that there was no evidence presented to show Byrd would be unable to testify at the trial & that taking a video deposition would not allow him enough time to prepare for cross examination. Vance allowed the video deposition, which occurred Wed after the pretrial conference concluded.

Two weeks has been set aside for Salyer’s trial. Vance ordered Kentucky State Police to provide security at the courthouse during the trial, in place of the Casey County Sheriff’s Dept. Rigdon’s trial has been set for Sept. Both Rigdon & Salyers have remained in jail under \$1 million bonds since their arrests more than a year ago.

The Supreme Court agree whit Hells Angels – Dec 20, 2013 – *Norway* – By Gunnar Hultgreen; www.Dagbladet.no - Police in Oslo tried a new & creative way to put a stop to the Hells Angels - who police believe is a criminal organization. Oslo police took action & tried in late to seize the Hells Angels clubhouse at Alnabru in Oslo. Hells Angels protested & took the matter to court. Oslo police lost first in the Oslo District Court as the Court of Appeal before the Supreme Court today gave the Hells Angels claim that there was no legal authority to seize the clubhouse. The Supreme Court has unanimously rejected the police's appeal to seize Hells Angels property Alnabru in Oslo. I note that neither the Supreme Court held there was no reason to believe that the house would escape before the criminal case comes up next spring , & that the appellate court correctly had emphasized that there was no need for the police to put themselves physically in possession of the house , says lawyer John Christian Elden representing Hells Angels . Elden also comes with the following insert to the Oslo police. They tried with this trick all the way, & it may in any case is determined that the “Angels “ have a quiet Christmas at home with himself, the lawyer said to Dagbladet.

Gainesville men in motorcycle club case await sentencing – Dec 21, 2013 – *Georgia* – By Emma Witman; www.GainesvilleTimes.com - Four Gainesville men will be sentenced in Gainesville's Fed court on drug charges after entering guilty pleas as part of plea agreements with the Gov't that will dismiss previously indicted charges. The charges stem from a 2-year undercover investigation of MC members, conducted by Fed agents. Davey Honeycutt, 42, who was charged with cocaine conspiracy & possession & being a convicted felon in possession of a firearm, pleaded guilty to conspiracy to distribute a controlled substance. Brandon Musser, 28, charged with cocaine conspiracy & possession, pleaded guilty to the same charges. Each faces a minimum sentences of 5 years in prison & a maximum of 40 years. Phillip Honeycutt, 47, charged with cocaine conspiracy & possession, pleaded guilty to use of a communications facility in the distribution of a controlled substance. The charge carries no mandatory minimum & a maximum sentence of 4 years imprisonment. The 3 entered pleas Dec. 13. Gainesville man Josue Guerrero, who was indicted in Jan, also pleaded guilty to conspiracy Dec. 17. Fed authorities charged 23 people in Aug last year. U.S. Atty Sally Quillian Yates said that all but 2 of the defendants charged in the investigation had direct ties to the Outlaw MC or other motorcycle groups affiliated with & controlled by the Outlaws. The most recent superseding indictment from Sept for the 4 men implicated 8 defendants in total, 5 of whom have pleaded guilty. As part of the plea agreement, defendants have agreed to cooperate “truthfully & completely” with the Gov't, including testifying at trial. Two defendants, Phillip Alexander & Jessi Castillo are scheduled for a Jan. 6 jury trial, court records show. In an Oct. 1 motion for defendant Thomas Coley, who also pleaded guilty Dec. 13, his attorney said the charges should be dismissed due to “Gov't over-involvement” by the FBI. “On the Gov't's own version of facts, it is clear that Gov't agents instigated the activity, provided the entire means for its execution, & ran the operation with such meager assistance from Coley that his presence was purely incidental,” Atty Albert Norton Jr. wrote. “Accepting as true the Gov't's fact theory, Coley was not necessary at all. He was pre-selected by Gov't agents in order to rope him into activity that he otherwise would have had nothing to do with. Another local implicated in the arrests, Gainesville man Reynol Castrejon, 22, pleaded guilty in March to conspiracy to distribute a controlled substance. Thus far, one defendant of the 6 cases

indicted has received a jury trial in Gainesville. Dawsonville man & Wingmen MC member James McGlothlin was found guilty by a jury Sept. 25 on charges of selling a firearm to a person knowing that the individual was a felon. He was sentenced to 5< years in prison & 5-years supervised release in July. Sentencing by U.S. District Court Judge Richard Story has not been scheduled for McGlothlin, the Honeycutts, Musser or Guerrero.

Man says his motorcycle gang is trying to kill him – Dec 23, 2013 – *Illinois* – By Nicole Leonhardt; www.Daily-Journal.com - The alleged victim of an overnight home invasion in Cabery told police he was being targeted by members of his former motorcycle gang. The 31-year-old man told police he heard intruders inside his home, located near the intersection of Illinois Route 115 & 6000S Road, at around 4 a.m. Sat, according to a Kankakee County sheriff's police report. Armed with a shotgun, the man fired a shot into his living room after he heard someone say, “kill him.” He then locked himself inside his bathroom, where he fired off a second shot through the door. No one was reported injured. The man told police he had been trying to leave a motorcycle gang & believed the invasion was in retaliation.

Internat'l Police Team Captures Finnish Drug Smugglers Pre-Christmas – Dec 23, 2013 – *Finland* – By www.FinnBay.com - A Finnish-Estonian drug network named Bandidos MC, who smuggled more than 70kgs of amphetamine, ecstasy & hashish to Finland just before the Christmas, was captured by an internat'l police team made of Estonian & Finnish police officers. Total of 25 suspects under the group name of Bandidos MC were captured by the police. The group is known to smuggle drugs to Finland continuously. In May 2013, Bandidos MC imported & distributed 30 kilograms of amphetamines in Espoo, Finland. This time, Police seized around 76 kilos of amphetamine, ecstasy & marijuana (hashish). The Gov't did not comment on whether what they will do with the drugs as well what legal rules they followed in capturing the group. Police said the group members communicated with each other by phone & on the internet. Criminal offenses will be dealt with in the District Court of Espoo towards the end of Jan 2014.

Outlaw Motorcycle Gangs Expand Throughout Costa Rica – Dec 24, 2013 – *Costa Rica* - by Jaime Lopez; <http://news.co.cr> - It all started with the Bandidos MC from Texas opening a chapter in Costa Rica in 2004. These days, there are the Gitanos, Coyotes & other 2-wheeled syndicates whose members show a predilection for tattoos, facial hair, leather jackets, Black Sabbath, & high-performance spark plugs. Should residents of Costa Rica be worried about this propagation? For all the reported criminality associated with motorcycle riding clubs, biker gangs in Costa Rica are nothing like the Mara Salvatrucha (MS-13) or the Mexican drug cartels that have been trying to get a foothold here. International biker gangs such as the Hells Angels have been associated with criminal activity, but people seem to forget that these are large societies; as such, crime is bound to surface at some point. Is there not corruption & crime found among large subsets of society such as Gov't workers & law enforcement? What is interesting about the adoption of the style, attitude & customs of motorcycle club members in Costa Rica is that, in a certain sense, there is little affinity to draw from. The roots of the Hells Angels & the Bandidos can be traced to military war veterans from the United States. Costa Rica does not even have an army, but self-respecting Tico Bandidos know about the late Don Chambers, a Vietnam War veteran who sought to bring the battlefield doctrine of the U.S. Marine Corps into the motorcycle riding lifestyle. MCs in Costa Rica are largely recreational. The gorgeous landscape of the country & her challenging topography make a great combination for motorcycle trips in the company of friends. Tropical riding clubs in Costa Rica do not always adhere to U.S. convention: Not all members ride H-D; many can be seen riding Asian motorcycles. This could be considered heresy in other parts of the world, but then again this is a country where there are riding clubs named Bikers Zero Stress. The same goes with leather jackets & accessories: Vinyl is often used as a replacement. Camaraderie is an important aspect of the biker gang lifestyle that Tico motorcycle clubs have easily adopted. This can be seen at the Whiskey Bar in Santa Ana, where expat & local bikers often meet to enjoy tales of the road, the widest selection of whiskey in Central America, & ice-cold beer.

Motorcycle Profiling 2013 - Dec 24, 2013 - *Arizona* - By Still Ray, Journeymen MC; AZ Confederation of MC s Chair

Rabble Rouser - January 2014: Some of you may recall last session at the Capitol we met Lyle Mann. Mr. Mann is in charge of educating Law Enforcement in AZ. He told us he was not in favor of changing any laws in the state but he was willing to work on the curriculum He also said he would share the changes made with us. I would say. We are making progress here. Below is the transcript of the DVD he sent us. Maybe we could play it at a COC meeting if there is enough interest. If nothing else here is a law enforcement officer that recognizes there are some problems.

Motorcycle Profiling 2013: Narrator (Ivan Gelo, officer Chandler Police Dept): "Generally, we update you on the bills that pass the legislature & were signed by the Governor. This segment however was prompted by a bill that failed to pass the Senate. Senate bill 1086 sought to mandate that Arizona POST prescribe "courses that emphasize the prohibition against motorcycle profiling." The bill described motorcycle profiling as "the sole fact that a person rides a motorcycle or wears motorcycle-related paraphernalia as the basis for taking any law enforcement action against the person, including arresting, searching or questioning the person without any other legal basis under the laws of this state or the United States & the Constitution of the United States or this state." Arizona POST opposes placing such specific training

mandates into its statute. But the topic presents a valuable opportunity to refresh officers on the critical concepts of reasonable suspicion & probable cause as they relate to stopping, searching, or arresting any person. But in this discussion, motorcycle riders. Proponents of the bill modeled it on a Washington State law; that they claim has reduced profiling by over ninety percent. This training segment is intended to remind officers that traffic stops of motorcycle riders, just like stops of any other motorists, must be based on reasonable suspicion, searches must be lawfully conducted, & arrests must be based on probable cause. Proponents of the bill contend that motorcycle clubs are subjected to wide-spread incidents of traffic stops & detention arising from the mere presence of the groups of motorcyclists riding together & wearing motorcycle related apparel. These stops they say invariably result in extended & intrusive questioning, invasive searches, demands for photographs, & other behavior far beyond the boundaries of a typical traffic stop. We all understand that in order to make a stop an officer needs to have reasonable suspicion that a person is involved in a criminal activity or committed a traffic violation. Officers are reminded that in order to conduct a terry stop to detain & question an individual, the facts & inferences taken as a whole must provide a particularized objective basis for suspecting the particular person being stopped is committing, has committed, or is about to commit criminal activity. Officers must be able to articulate & document all the specific facts & circumstances that were relied on to justify the stop or seizure. Reasonable suspicion allows officers to stop or detain for a reasonable time to investigate further, to confirm or dispel the suspicion of criminal activity. The investigation may lead to the conclusion that there is probable cause to arrest or search, or the person is not involved in criminal activity & must be released. An officer may use reasonable force to control the situation. Solely riding a motorcycle & or wearing motorcycle apparel is not reasonable suspicion of any crime or traffic violation. An officer must have more & be able to articulate it in order to stop or detain a motorcyclist or any other person. The Arizona Confederation of Motorcycle Clubs is trying to educate its members of the legal standards applicable to stops, searches, & arrests. They've made public records requests of POST, obtained & published the basic lesson plans for traffic stops, ethics, motorcycle gangs, probable cause, reasonable suspicion, search & seizure, constitutional law, & civil liability. Their members are being told how to exercise their constitutional rights. Officers must respect the civil rights of all persons & take all law enforcement actions accordingly. Officers should not be surprised if they are questioned about their actions given the dissemination of this information. The Confederation points out that the vast majority of motorcycle clubs today are not gangs. In a letter to a state Senator, one member states; "...approximately 75% of clubs & their members are military veterans. People are not criminals simply because they ride a motorcycle or wear a club patch. There are firefighter clubs, union worker clubs, Latino clubs, clubs who ride specific motorcycles such as English bikes or Japanese bikes or sport bikes...". Certainly there are criminals who ride motorcycles & there are criminal motorcycle gangs. It is the task of law enforcement to enforce the laws against these criminals in a constitutional & lawful manor. Stops supported by reasonable suspicion, searches based on valid consent or probable cause, & detentions that are reasonable based on articulatable facts & circumstances that are in existence at the time. Central Town Monitoring Bikers – Dec 26, 2013 – *Canada* – By www.VOCM.com - They mightn't be cruising the blacktop while the snow is on the ground, but the Outlaws MC is still in town in Grand Falls-Windsor. The central community isn't the only corner of the province where bikers have set up shop - there's a chapter also in Gander, & reports of chapters on the west coast of the island as well. Grand Falls-Windsor Mayor Al Hawkins says the Town will continue to work with the RCMP on the issue, but he maintains this is something that has to be dealt with from a criminal perspective. The Outlaws have been in town for a couple of years now, & Hawkins says he's confident police are handling matters appropriately. He says unless there is some criminal activity involved, everybody has a right to live where they wish to live. As a town, he says they've been very careful in how they've reacted to this. Hawkins says all communities are dealing with criminal issues & Grand Falls-Windsor is no different. He says education is key & that will be ongoing. He says in 2014 the town will be hiring 2 new municipal police officers.

Your Rights While In Custody – Dec 27, 2013 - *U.S.A.* - By Law Office of David R. Houston; www.jdsupra.com - The fact that you are in custody either following a conviction or awaiting trial does not mean that all of your constitutional rights disappear. As a rule, you have no reasonable expectation of privacy in your cell or your person while in custody, so law enforcement can search you & your belongings. To a more limited extent, they can also search your incoming & outgoing mail. However, other important constitutional rights still adhere to citizens in custody...

The right to reading material: You have the right to receive legal publications & communications from attorneys & publishing houses. A recent attempt by Nevada prison officials to ban prisoner receipt of legal publications has drawn a 1st Amendment lawsuit to protect the inmates' rights to reading material.

Protection from discrimination: The Fourteenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution protects inmates against mistreatment or discrimination on the basis of gender, race, or religious affiliation.

Prohibition on cruel & unusual punishment: The Eighth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution prohibits cruel & unusual punishment, which has been interpreted to include ensuring the provision of decent housing & food for prisoners. However, courts traditionally do not interfere with prison authorities' classification of prisoners. ? The decision to classify a prisoner as a maximum security or minimum security inmate is almost always left to the discretion of prison authorities.

Right to due process: The 5th Amendment of the US Constitution states that an alleged criminal must be accorded due process of law before being deprived of life, liberty or property. For prisoners, this means that they have a right to due process even while incarcerated. An inmate has a right to appeal a criminal conviction or sentence, a right to appeal any administrative action by prison staff & a right to the parole process. However, the right to litigate has been severely circumscribed by the Prison Litigation Reform Act (PLRA) of 1996, which has placed innumerable & time-bound requirements in the way of inmate appeals. If you know or are someone in custody who is being deprived of the constitutional rights to which all citizens are entitled while incarcerated, then avail yourself of our 6th Amendment right under the U.S. Constitution to counsel.

La Crosse motorcycle gang members arrested after bar confrontation - Dec 31, 2013 – *Wisconsin* – By Anne Jungen; <http://LaCrosseTribune.com> - La Crosse police early Sunday arrested 2 armed members of the Outlaws motorcycle gang after a confrontation at a downtown bar, according to reports. An employee of SawTooth Sam's Saloon at 223 Pearl St. flagged down police about 2:30 a.m. when 2 men wouldn't leave the bar after threatening a bouncer with a knife. Officers found Samuel Keller, 31, & Adam Baumgartner, 34, both of La Crosse & wearing Outlaws clothing, talking with the owner & a manager inside the tavern after closing time, reports stated. One bouncer told police he saw the 4 men talking & told them it was "ridiculous" to argue over a jacket, according to reports. Keller yelled at him that "no one" touches his jacket. "Do you want to die?" Keller threatened at knifepoint, reports stated. The bouncer retreated as Keller approached. The man wasn't injured, & several other employees verified his account. Keller, who admitted he was an Outlaw, told police no one asked him to leave & denied threatening anyone. Police found 5 small bags with about 1 gram of cocaine in each & 2 knives in his possession. Keller had a 0.17 percent blood-alcohol content. Officers also found a fully loaded revolver in Baumgartner's vest. He did not have a permit to carry the firearm. Baumgartner told police Keller didn't threaten the employee with a knife. He had a 0.18 percent alcohol level, reports stated. Police took the weapons & the Outlaws clothing as evidence. Keller was charged Monday with possession with intent to deliver cocaine, carrying a concealed weapon & disorderly conduct in La Crosse County Circuit Court. Baumgartner posted his bond & faces charges of carrying a concealed weapon & carrying a handgun where alcohol is sold when he appears in court at a later date.

When Searches Are Illegal – Jan 2, 2014 - *U.S.A.* – By Stephen Palmer; www.jdsupra.com - Traffic stops are usually nerve-racking events. You just know that you're going to get some sort of ticket. For some people, traffic stops churn their stomachs even more because they have drugs or guns in their car & don't want the police to find out. The courts have long allowed the police to search the passenger compartment of a car after a stop & arrest. The police are also allowed to search any containers or other closed items found in the car following the driver's arrest. But what if you're only a passenger in the arrested person's vehicle?

Can the police search your purse if you're only a passenger? An Ohio court recently addressed the question of searching passengers. Michelle Caulfield was a passenger in a car stopped in Centerville, Ohio by a sheriff's deputy. The stated reason for the stop was that the rear license plate was covered by snow. The deputy checked the driver & Caulfield for any outstanding warrants & found that the driver was wanted on various charges. The deputy placed him under arrest. Caulfield's record came up clean. The driver consented to a search of his car, & the deputy ordered Caulfield to get out. She did so, taking her purse with her. The deputy ordered her to leave her purse on the seat. She followed the deputy's instructions & waited outside. The deputy searched the purse & found marijuana in it. Caulfield asked the court to throw out the evidence as the product of an illegal search. The court agreed with Caulfield. The search of the inside of the car was justified by the driver's consent, but the driver had no legal right to consent to the search of Caulfield's purse, which was neither his nor under his control. Furthermore, the deputy had no reason to believe that there was anything illegal hidden in Caulfield's purse. In light of those findings, the court ruled that the search of the purse was illegal. Therefore, the prosecution could not use the evidence against Caulfield.

Motorcycle gang refuses to leave residential neighborhood – Jan 3, 2014 – *Denmark* – By Ray Weaver – <http://cphpost.dk> - Even though the city has ordered them to leave, bikers say they will fight to remain... Members of the Bandidos motorcycle gang who had purchased & been occupying a property in Copenhagen's Vanløse neighborhood were supposed to vacate the premises by the time fireworks rang in the New Year. The city had served notice that the gang's use of the home as a clubhouse violated a 1918 housing clause stating that the property can only be used as a family home. The bikers remain in the home, & have filed an appeal with Natur og Miljøklagenævnet, the environmental appeals board, to overturn the city's decision to toss them out. Neighbors who had been looking forward to seeing the taillights of the gangs' motorcycles expressed disappointment at the delay. "We are obviously annoyed & disappointed," Mette Fløjborg, who lives across from the bikers, told DR Nyheder. "We hope it will happen, we have always had a 'we'll believe it when we see it' attitude."

Neighbors remain frightened: Fløjborg says that as long as the bikers remain in the house, she fears for the safety of her 2 young sons. She pointed out that her neighbor, Lars Jensen, who has been vocal in his opposition to the bikers being in the neighborhood, has had his house vandalized a number of times & was the victim of a burglary just a few days ago. Police have yet to connect the Bandidos to any of those crimes. Two City Council members – Jakob Hougaard (S) & Jakob Næsager (K) – have fought long & hard to get the bikers evicted from the house, & they say that the appeal should not prevent them from being tossed out. "Usually, appeals do not suspend the process, so the order remains in force, & it is up to the police to enforce the law," Næsager told DR Nyheder. Hougaard said that if the bikers failed to move out while the appeal was being considered, the city would take the "drastic step" of starting criminal proceedings.

Bikers not backing down: The lawyer representing the Bandidos member who owns the home said that they are ready for a fight. "We will take the case all the way to the Supreme Court if necessary," Michael Juul Eriksen told Dr. Nyheder. Eriksen said that he believed that the Bandidos have the right to remain in the house pending the outcome of their appeal. The saga of bikers in Vanløse has been going on since last July. In October, the gang told neighbors that they would be glad to move out, provided that the neighbors paid them 500,000 kroner.

At long last, Adam Lee Hall's triple murder trial to start – Jan 5, 2014 – *Massachusetts* - By Andrew Amelinckx; www.BerkshireEagle.com - It has been a long & twisted road to trial for Adam Lee Hall. More than 2 years have passed since Hall, a member of the local Hells Angels, allegedly took part in the murder of 3 Pittsfield men -- one of whom was expected to testify that Hall had beaten him with a baseball bat. Along the way, the case has seen a new defense attorney appointed for Hall after a dispute with his initial lawyer; a surprise re-indictment of Hall & his 2 co-defendants; & a flood of discovery material from the prosecution that has prompted a protest from defense attorneys who claim it was nearly impossible to sort through. A single judge has been appointed to oversee the sprawling case, which has been split into 3 separate trials that have been moved to Hampden Superior Court in Springfield over concerns about pretrial publicity in Berkshire County. And requests to push back the date of Hall's trial -- from both the defense & prosecution -- have been denied. That trial begins with jury selection on Mon. **It was Aug. 28, 2011**, as Tropical Storm Irene was bearing down on the Berkshires, when David Glasser, his roommate Edward

Frampton, & their friend & neighbor, Robert Chadwell, disappeared from Glasser's Linden Street home. The men's remains were discovered by police nearly 2 weeks later. Their bodies were dismembered & disposed of in garbage bags that were discovered buried on private property in Becket, according to court documents. Autopsies revealed they had been shot to death. Where they were actually killed remains a mystery, but investigators continue to believe Pittsfield State Forest somehow played a role. The murder weapons were never recovered. The police investigation quickly centered on Hall, 36, of Peru, & 2 others, David Chalue, 46, of North Adams, & Caius Veiovis, 32, of Pittsfield. The men are facing multiple counts of murder, kidnapping & witness intimidation. They have all denied the charges & remain in jail without bail. Chalue is allegedly a member of the Aryan Brotherhood, a white supremacist prison gang & crime syndicate. Hall was the sergeant of arms for the local chapter of the Hells Angels, police have said. A fourth defendant, David Casey, 65, of Canaan, N.Y., is facing accessory charges for allegedly using his excavator to help bury the bodies. He also has pleaded not guilty & remains in jail on 1 million bail. **According to police**, on the night of the abduction Hall arranged to leave his car near the site where the bodies were later recovered. After dropping off that car, he was seen leaving in Veiovis' vehicle, according to a police report. He was later seen by several witnesses dumping items into the Housatonic River in Lenox, police said. Chalue & Hall allegedly took Hall's car to a local junk dealer, where it was crushed a day after the victims disappeared. Police & prosecutors have said Glasser was killed to prevent him from testifying against Hall in an upcoming trial. The other 2 victims were killed to eliminate any witnesses, police said. In 2009, Hall allegedly beat Glasser with a baseball bat. The next year, Hall tried to frame Glasser to discredit him as a witness in that case, police said. Hall was out on bail at the time the alleged murders were committed.

Police said Hall had been "desperate" to avoid prison & had met with the FBI twice in Sept 2010 in an attempt to become an informant against other Hells Angels. The FBI turned him down because he was "uncontrollable & much too dangerous," according to the report. Hall, in a letter to The Eagle, denied he attempted to become an informant or that he played any part in the men's murders. In Aug 2012, nearly a year after the defendants were originally indicted, Berkshire District Atty David Capeless presented the case to the grand jury for a 2nd time. According to 2 law professors interviewed by The Eagle, the move may have been done to patch any potential holes in the case. Capeless wouldn't comment. In previous hearings in the case Capeless acknowledged there was no DNA evidence directly tying the 3 defendants to the murders, but said there was "significant" evidence of a kidnapping & that Hall & Chalue could be placed at the scene of the crimes. He conceded that the evidence against Veiovis is "circumstantial," but said prosecutors still have a strong case against him. The trial for Hall, who is represented by atty Alan Black, is expected to take between a month to 6 weeks. Chalue's trial is scheduled to begin April 17. Veiovis' trial will follow Chalue's. No trial date has been set in Casey's case.

“Just a Hunch” Isn’t a Good Enough Reason for an Arrest – Jan 6, 2014 – *U.S.A.* – By Stephen Palmer; www.jdsupra.com - Police officers are trained professionals, & many of them have developed sharp instincts for observing criminal behavior; that is, they have a hunch when something isn’t right. But a hunch is still an insufficient reason for an arrest, Ohio court recently ruled.

A nervous woman arouses police suspicion: Ranger Lukas Hammermeister was on patrol at a park in Montgomery County, Ohio when he observed Meagan White sitting in her parked car in a distant parking lot. Hammermeister drove by & saw White hunched over the center console of her vehicle. She saw the ranger, uttered a curse word, left her car & walked into the woods. Hammermeister kept watching. He saw White leave the woods & return to her car. She drove away. Hammermeister saw that White had a broken taillight & called for backup. The ranger stopped White, gave her a verbal warning for the taillight & told her she was free to leave. He noted that she appeared very nervous & was trembling. By this time, the second officer had arrived at White’s car. Hammermeister then asked White if he could ask her a question. She agreed. He told her that he’d seen her actions in the parking lot & asked if she had anything illegal in her car. She said no. Then Hammermeister asked for permission to conduct a search, but he neglected to tell White that she had the right to refuse. White agreed to the search & got out of her car. Hammermeister found heroin in the center console & a marijuana pipe. White would later ask the court to suppress the heroin evidence & dismiss the case against her.

A skeptical court finds nervousness alone does not provide reasonable cause to detain: The court agreed with White. It held that the officers did not have reasonable suspicion that White was doing anything criminal that would allow them to detain her & search her car after the traffic stop. Although White consented to the search, the court found that her consent was involuntary. White was never told that she had the right to say no to the officer’s search request. Furthermore, she was surrounded by 2 officers, making her feel as if she had no choice in the matter. If police officers stop you, they must have a reasonable cause for doing so. Hammermeister had no specific reason, but simply a hunch, & the court declared that a hunch isn’t good enough.

Queensland’s anti-bikie laws are violating human rights – Jan 7, 2014 – *Australia* – By Bridie Jabour; www.TheGuardian.com - New human rights commissioner says he may have to fight the legislation after five alleged bikies arrested in Gold Coast... The incoming human rights commissioner, Tim Wilson, says he will fight to have Queensland’s anti-bikie laws repealed if they continue to be used to arrest people for things as simple as buying ice cream. Five alleged Victorian bikies were arrested under the state’s anti-association laws on the Gold Coast on Sun morning at the Hilton hotel while they were holidaying together. The laws were introduced in Queensland last year as part of a suite of anti-bikie legislation & ban 3 or more members of outlaw motorcycle gangs meeting together in public places. Defense lawyer, Bill Potts, who is representing 2 of the 5, said the group were first stopped by police on their way to buy ice cream after having Chinese for dinner on Fri & then arrested a few days later. Wilson said the arrests had reconfirmed his deep concerns about the laws. “They [the laws] are violating the human right of association & treating people engaged in seemingly lawful acts as criminal,” he said. “There is no basis for them.” When asked if he would pursue the rollback of the anti-association laws when he takes up the role of commissioner with the Human Rights Commission next month, Wilson replied: “If they continue to be used in this way it will be. It’s criminal to buy an ice cream now, it’s an example of the slippery slope that is the danger of diluting

the human right of association.” One of the men, Daniel Lovett, 30, is alleged to be the sergeant-at-arms of the Melbourne chapter of the Hells Angels, while Kresimir Basic is alleged to be a member of the gang & Darren Hayley a prospective member. Bane Ajajbegovic & Dario Halolovic are alleged to be associated with the Comanchero Hallam chapter bikie gang. The 5 did not enter a plea when they appeared in Southport magistrates court on Mon & are being remanded in custody until their next hearing on 17 Feb. It is the first time visitors from outside Queensland have been arrested under the association laws & none of the men were wearing bikie colors when they originally drew the attention of police in Surfers Paradise. Detective Inspector Brendan Smith of Taskforce Maxima said it was unusual for members of different motorcycle gangs to be congregating together & though they said they were on holiday, police were investigating further. It has been reported that the men were engaged in “peace talks” between the gangs but Potts, who is representing Ajajbegovic & Halolovic, rejected the reports. Smith said police also had intelligence that the men had met with Queensland bikies while on the Gold Coast.

Bikies banned from group sex in public – Jan 7, 2014 – *Australia* – By <http://News.NineMSN.com.au> - Bikies who engage in group sex anywhere other than private homes can now be charged in Queensland as part of the state’s tough new anti-bikie laws... The revelation came after the state Gov’t answered a question posted on Premier Campbell Newman’s Facebook page about outlaw motorcycle gang members & group sex. The constituent, asking about the VLAD (Vicious Lawless Association Disestablishment) laws wrote: “Do they make a ménage a trois illegal & if so where this leaves orgies & swingers clubs?” A staffer for Premier Newman then responded: “The offence is for 3 or more participants in a criminal organization to meet in public. So yes, it would be illegal for 3 criminal gang members to have sex in public.” Lawyers, however, have questioned the validity of the laws & why they were reaching into people’s bedrooms. Criminal lawyer Bill Potts told News Limited: “There’s no room under the bed for Newman or the Gov’t & they should think about why they are reaching into people’s private lives.”

Queensland’s war against bikies - Jan 7, 2014 – *Australia* - By Gabrielle Burke; <http://blogs.ABC.net.au> - Independent MP Peter Wellington yesterday protested outside the Maroochydore Court House against the State Govt’s anti-bikie laws. The Member for Nicklin rode a sidecar motorbike to the courthouse with a coffin displaying the sign, “Democracy killed by Newman’s VLAD laws.” Wellington implored the State Gov’t to amend the anti-bikie legislation which has seen Sunshine Coast bikie gang members & associates arrested without bail & held in solitary confinement until their court hearing. Peter Wellington, & Acting Attorney-General David Crisafulli spoke to Annie Gaffney about the controversial new laws.

Commissioner Ian Stewart, a regular user of social media Twitter, replied to several complaints after it was revealed a man had been fined \$146 for stretching his leg while riding a motorbike to work. Jake Sloman was riding along the Logan Motorway on Mon when he stretched his leg. Police pulled him over & fined him \$146. The offence? "Fail to keep both feet on footrest". The fine has caused outrage on Twitter & on Sloman's Facebook page, with people saying taking this particular road rule to the letter would mean almost every motorcycle rider would be liable to be fined. Stewart, a regular user of social media Twitter, replied to several complaints about Loman's fine. When asked if riders were not allowed to stretch their legs on the highway, Commissioner Stewart replied "of course you are".

2nd Outlaw charged in armed altercation – Jan 9, 2014 – *Wisconsin* – By <http://LaCrosseTribune.com> - Prosecutors Wed charged an Outlaws MC member with having a handgun in a downtown bar. Adam Baum-Gartner, 34, of La Crosse is charged in La Crosse County Circuit Court with carrying a concealed weapon & carrying a handgun where alcohol is sold. He returns to court in March. Baumgartner was at SawTooth Sam's Saloon at 223 Pearl St. after bar time Dec. 29 when police say another Outlaw threatened a bouncer with a knife, according to reports. He did not have a concealed carry permit. Police found Baumgartner with a fully loaded revolver & co-defendant Samuel Keller, 31, of La Crosse with 2 knives & cocaine. Keller's case for possession with intent to deliver cocaine, carrying a concealed weapon & disorderly conduct is pending.

NRP officer sentenced over Hells Angel's leak – Jan 9, 2014 – *Canada* – By www.OurWindsor.ca - Niagara Regional Police officer convicted for leaking confidential info & police documents to the Hell's Angels MC has been sentenced to 4 years in prison. Const. Dean Rudge was convicted on Aug. 2 of breach of trust by a public officer for leaks that took place between Aug 2004 & Sept 2006. He was sentenced Wed by Justice P.B. Hambly. NRP chief Jeff McGuire was in court Wed afternoon to attend the sentencing hearing. "Whenever a police officer is involved in a criminal act, or any other act that violates their sworn oath of office, the reputation of the Service is tarnished & public trust is lost," he said in a statement. "It is my responsibility, one which I take very seriously, to ensure that violations such as those committed by Rudge in this case, are investigated in a professional & diligent manner. That has occurred in this case & we will now continue to work to restore the trust that has been damaged." Rudge has been suspended since April 4, 2007. The Police Services Act does not allow police services to suspend officers without pay. With the sentencing, the officer will be suspended from the NRP without pay effective immediately. The NRPS will address the officer's future employment status through the Police Services Act discipline process.
